#### **Curriculum Offer**

Pearling Season School provides full-time supervised education for pupils of KG1 through to Grade 13, using English language.

We offer a broad curriculum that challenges and extends the pupils but is sufficiently flexible to be differentiated to suit their individual needs. Where a pupil has an identified additional learning need, we will offer a program appropriate to their needs.

We ensure pupils acquire speaking, listening, literacy and numeracy skills

We aim to create a stimulating teaching environment where our pupils develop a love of learning and strive to achieve the highest standards

Our curriculum is designed to prepare our pupils thoroughly for their exams but, most importantly, for life beyond that.

We offer a broad and balanced curriculum which in addition to academic subjects includes the arts and music as well as practical and sporting activities.

We have personal, social, health and economic education in dedicated PSHE lessons, which reflects the school's ethos and encourages respect for other people

# **Progression and Graduation**

## **Additional Learning Needs**

Pearling Season School is fortunate in having a dedicated SENCO. The SENCO supports staff in identifying pupils' difficulties and in planning teaching strategies and she also liaises with parents.

There are two provisions for students identified with an ALN:

- Students assessed (during the admission process) with a high order additional learning need, such as Downs Syndrome, high order austism or behavioural needs, have a dedicated ALN curriculum, specialist teacher and support staff.
- 2) Students identified (during the admission process or during the academic year) as having academic weaknesses arising from disabilities such as dyslexia or dyspraxia, or have low confidence and need extra help, are given learning support during the school day.

We have specialist support teachers to ensure specific needs are met.

### **Specialist ALN Classes**





We are offering In- Class Speech Therapy for all the ALN classes on a weekly basis. The Speech Therapy class support is following the same program as the Additional Speech Therapy sessions.	Teachers are getting support from the Speech Therapist in order to help students with language development and better pronunciation, as well as the articulation.	The Speech Therapist is working closely with the Shadow Teachers. They are receiving instructions on how to help promote language development for their student and to give support during class periods.	We offer an Additional Speech program 5 days per week for the students most in need. Every day, the students who are enrolled in the additional speech therapy program will have their 1:1 sessions with the Speech Therapist. We offer a cycle of 10 sessions, distributed over 5 weeks. Each student gets 2 sessions per week. The program runs during school and after school hours.

## **Inclusion Options**

### **Social Inclusion**

ALN students attend mainstream classes such as PE, Art, Music and breaktimes, in order to promote socialization.

### **Partial Inclusion**

ALN students attend specific academic subjects in Mainstream classes, where students can meet the criteria and integrate in a similar level as their year group.

# **Transition to Mainstream**

ALN students that have shown sufficient progress academically and behaviorally, to gradually transition to mainstream classes.

### **Full Time Inclusion**

SEN Students in mainstream with or without support of shadow teacher.

# **English as a Foreign Language**

Pearling Season International School has many students joining the school from other countries and cultures, and we make every effort to integrate them into the life of the school. As English is used as the main language, students enter the school with different levels of fluency.

Students' English language needs are assessed on entry and if required, additional support is provided to improve levels of written and spoken English language. These sessions may take place on an individual basis or as a small group and are generally during PE or French lessons.

### **Preparation for Exams**

Although the aim of our pupils is to achieve the necessary grades to their senior school, Pearling Season International Schools aim to provide as wide a variety of extracurricular activities as possible, catering to the needs of the individual, especially in music, sport and the arts. This gives our pupils the opportunities to excel in many different areas and to be educated in a rich and stimulating environment. Nonetheless, we do not lose sight of the importance of this aim, and, to this end, each pupil is helped to prepare for three exams in each year group (December, April and June). Each department provides revision notes and tests to help every pupil prepare, and this process is designed to encourage pupils to learn strategies to make the best of exams.

# Field Trips/Visits to the School

Pearling Season Schools aim to provide its students with a wealth of experiences, and, to this end, departments organise educational trips away from school as well as visits to the school from outside agencies. Details of these will be found in the Field Trip policy document.

#### **Assessment and Reporting**

Regular assessments are an important part of the teaching process both in helping to identify progress in learning, or difficulties therein, as well as monitoring the effectiveness of the delivery of the curriculum.

As well as three yearly exams, all students undertake key assessments throughout each term, which allows our teachers to closely monitor progress in the lead up to the exams.

At the end of each term the parents receive a report on their child covering academic subjects, learning behaviour, homework and attendance. These reports are designed to give clear and accurate information on their child's progress as well as an overview of the work they have been engaged upon that term.

In addition to opportunities to meet and talk with teachers on regular occasions throughout the year, there are formal Parent Consultation Meetings for each year group on an annual basis. This gives teacher and parent a chance to discuss the child's progress in more detail and make provision for the year ahead.
